5. AGREEMENT WITH TIME WARNER FOR INTERNET SERVICE

6. CHANGE ORDER NO. 2 - WILSON ROAD DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

City Manager Boeske presented Change Order No. 2 for the Wilson Road Drainage

Improvement Project and recommended approval of the change order. The change order is for an add of \$ 60,681.27 which brings the total project cost to \$ 1,440,201.67. The increase is the adjustment of the final measured quantities used to complete the project. Councilman Allan Steagall moved to approve Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$60,681.27.

7. VARIANCE REQUEST - CITY OF HUMBLE CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 19 SECTION 11 - FOR CONCRETE POURS AT SOUTHWEST WASTEWATER PLANT EXPANSION - CSA CONSTRUCTION, INC.

City Manager Boeske presented a variance request to the Code of Ordinances Chapter 19 Section 11 from CSA Construction, Inc. CSA would like to be allowed to make concrete pours in the early morning hours for the Southwest Wastewater Plant Expansion Project. They contend that the early morning pours are necessary for the following reasons:

- 1. Less traffic on the road will allow trucks to get to the job site sooner and with less risk.
- 2. The concrete temperature will remain lower, resulting in stronger concrete with fewer shrinkage cracks.
- 3. Employees will be working in cooler temperatures, reducing the risks of heat related stress.
- 4. The concrete batch plants would not be making other pours at this time so they would be able to dedicate all of their resources to these big pours.

Director of Public Works Barry Brock added the only residential area to be affected by these pours would be Deerbrook Forest Apartments. He stated the areas being poured are located on the south side of the plant and at a distance of over 300 feet from the apartments. He then recommended approval of the variance. Mayor McMannes moved to grant the variance request to CSA Construction, Inc.
